Objective

The aim of this programme is to review the progress, successes, achievements and challenges in our regional capacity building efforts, with a view to redefining the priorities and targets on which we will focus our collective efforts in the coming year. The programme also explored important topical issues which are of relevance to capacity building development in our respective institutions.

Presenters

Mr. Oliver Kapepa – A Management Consultant who is the Chief Executive of Colonnade Business Leadership School. Prior to that he was the Group Training and Development Manager for First Mutual Holding, before he joined from SEDCO where he was Head of Human Resources and Administration, a development finance institution. He is also a published author of the literary work, *The Boiling Cauldron*. Oliver has extensive exposure in HR Due Diligence earned during his tenure with IDC and SADC DRFC linked assignments.

Mr. Kogan Pillay – Head PPP Network – SADC-DFRC. He assists SADC countries to develop PPP policies, frameworks and institutional arrangements to deliver bankable projects to the marketplace. He also coordinates the stakeholders, other 3P Networks and significant capacity building projects. Prior to SADC-DFRC, he was the Senior Project Development Manager - Project Preparation and Advisory as well as Investment Banking that responsible to identify and develop bankable projects for private sector participation with DBSA. He was the Director of Business Development PPP Unit of National Treasury of South Africa from Dec 2004 until 2011. From May 1996 to August 2004, he was the Business Development Director for IZAZI Solutions, responsible for the provision of strategic direction to development banks relating to access to financial services for affordable housing initiatives and funding of SMME's. He was the Senior Policy Advisor at the Ontario Ministry of Financial Institutions from May 1989 until January 1996 and prior to that, he was associated to York University in Canada as Research Assistant and Teachers Assistant briefly in September 1988 until May 1989

Mr. Jakob Naomab – Training and Development Practitioner at the Development Bank of Namibia.

Mr. Tetsuya Fukunaga – JICA Expert at DFRC. He was selected as JICA Advisor to SADC-DFRC to promote i) enhancement of training programs, ii) promotion of investment by Japanese private companies, iii) strengthening of partnerships with stakeholders and iv) support of TICAD* process and JICA's activities.

Mr. Fukunaga led or participated in more than 100 research and consulting projects for economic and industrial development in developing countries under Mitsubishi UFJ Research and Consulting, affiliate to Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi UFJ, Ltd. and one of the most influential think tanks in Japan, as a project leader as well as a project member from 1992. During this period, he conducted field studies in 61 different countries all over the world especially in the areas of i) regional economic and industrial development, ii) development finance, iii) private sector development and iv) poverty reduction. In recent 10 years, his area of projects is highly concentrated on Sub-Saharan African countries within the framework of TICAD process.
