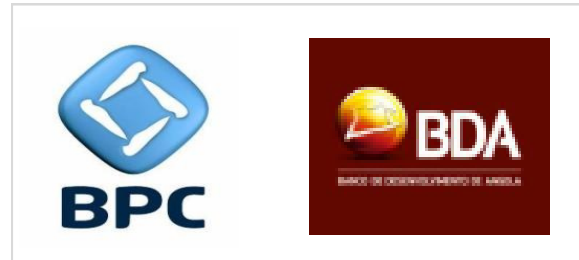

## Chief Executive Officers' Forum



Financing Industrialisation and the role of DFIs in SADC

## Objective

The forum will focus on discussing the state and prospects of industrialisation in SADC, especially given the adoption of a Regional Industrialisation Strategy and Roadmap by SADC member states.

In this context, the Forum explores the role that development finance institutions can play in promoting and facilitating industrialisation in the region, and ensuring the alignment of development finance strategy to the regional industrial strategy and the Regional Indicative Strategic Development Plan.

## Speakers

**Mr. Farai Zizhou**, a Zimbabwean National, holds a Masters and Bachelor's degrees in Economics from the University of Zimbabwe obtained in the 1980s. He also holds a diploma in Statistics from Uppsala University in Sweden.

Mr. Zizhou's work experience includes 8 years at various economic planning positions in Government (in Zimbabwe), 11 years on industry related issues at Confederation of Zimbabwe Industries, 3 years at a Research Institute in Botswana with a focus on research in support of SADC's Regional Integration agenda, one and a half years on SADC-EU project on implementation of the FIP, individual

consultancy with special focus on industrialisation policies in Southern Africa.

Mr. Zizhou is based at the SADC Secretariat in Gaborone. He is a founding non-executive director of CBZ Life, the fastest growing Life company in Zimbabwe.

**Mr. João Cunha** is Director of Business and Financing Program at the Banco de Desenvolvimento de Angola.

**Ms. Lynette Chen** is an African development expert, having actively contributed to initiatives such as the BEE Charter and the Presidential International Advisory Council on ICT in South Africa.

As CEO of NEPAD Business Foundation, she leads a unique organisation that focuses on representing and mobilising businesses to become involved in and support African development goals.

She is deeply passionate about the continent and believes that in order for social and economic transformation to take place, we need to advocate for private sector-led initiatives aligned to the African Union's NEPAD programmes.

Lynette also serves on the Board of Directors of FANRPAN, a continental organisation focusing on impacting policies in the agriculture sector.

She is currently a Fellow of the African Leadership Initiative which is run by the Aspen Institute.

**Dr. Lufeyo Banda** is currently a Director for finance and development practice. Over the past 10 years his work and interests have evolved around the nexus of development finance, and support to industrial development, infrastructure development, policy frameworks, and mobilisation of private and public investment for regional projects.

He holds a Ph.D. in Economics from University of Cape Town. Lufeyo is currently advising SADC on how they can come up with various innovative options of funding regional projects which include industrial and infrastructure projects. In previous functions, he worked at SADC Secretariat as an Advisor on development finance.

Dr. Banda is currently based in Botswana where he supported a wide range of issues in finance, including enhancement of development finance institutions, harmonisation of capital markets, and payment systems.

He has also been working with African Development Bank on the assessment of African sub-regional development banks and project preparation facilities contribution to infrastructure development.
